Creamery Square - The Players

Creamery Square is located on Waugh's River in Tatamagouche, Nova Scotia. The site is managed by the Creamery Square Association and features The Tatamagouche Farmers' Market operated by the Tatamagouche Farmers' Market Cooperative, and The Margaret Fawcett Norrie Heritage Centre under the

supervision of the Creamery Square Heritage Society.

The last phase of construction is now underway - The Creamery Square Centre for the Arts, which will be managed and operated by the Creamery Square Arts Society.

Creamery Square recently presented "Bard by the

Bay", produced by the North Shore Players.

A Quick and Dirty boat building challenge saw 4 teams of novice boat builders each create their own wooden canoe on site.

The award winning **Margaret Fawcett Norrie Heritage Centre** in the original Creamery Building is sure to delight and educate all ages. The professionally designed interactive displays let you journey 290 million years back in time to see the creatures that walked the **Brule Shore**.

Learn from Boiler Bob what it was like to work at the Creamery, producing thousands of pounds of the famous Tatamagouche Butter.

Explore the history of the once thriving North Shore boat building industry.

about 17th century Acadian dyke-building, early Mi'kmaq settlements, and life in the Tatamagouche area in the 19th and 20th centuries – all part of the **Sunrise Trail Museum**.

The **Anna Swan Museum** tells the life story of our local giantess. Research any of our exhibits online and investigate detailed genealogy records, and maps in our Resource Centre with the **North Shore Archives** staff.

The **Gift Shop** has a wide selection of books on local history, flora, fauna and stories, educational and fun children's activities, and locally crafted souvenirs and art work.

The **Boat Shop**, housed in the historic Shed Building, currently displays the restoration project of an historic Acadian Chaloupe.

Our latest addition is the Creamery Square Centre for the Arts, featuring the historic Ice House, as a visual arts display gallery, foyer for the main auditorium and intimate performance space. The main 160 seat auditorium will provide a stunning performance venue for theatre as well as a professional designed acoustic performing and recording venue for musicians. There will be visual arts events, workshops, private functions, conferences and more. The Senator's Stage provides an outdoor venue for theatre, music and workshops.
